McKEE CEMETERY

This abandoned burying ground is on the old Alonzo Sheets (more recently Joseph Richards) farm, on 250N about one and three-tenths mile west of 250N & 400W, in Rochester Township, Fulton County, Indiana.

It is at the very back of a field about two city blocks north of the road. Stones were read as found, not in any rows.

Anthony W. McKee was born in Penn or Ohio, and is said to have been in the War of 1812. He was born June 1, 1795. He married Nancy Agnew, and they were residents of Shelby Co Ind by ca.1834; and in Fulton Co Ind by 1850, residents of Rochester Twp with six children. He was living with Russell McKee (probably his son) in 1860, age 64 years.

Children of Anthony W. and Nancy (Agnew) McKee included: (1) Mary A. b.ca.1817 Ohio, m. by 1836, Shelby Co Ind, James Keely (1812-1892); (2) Isaac b.ca.1830 Ohio; (3) Riley G. b.ca.1834 Ind, m. 1855 Mary A. Thurston; (4) Phebe b.ca.1835 Ind; (5) William b.ca.1837 Ind; (6) James 1838-1859; (7) Martin b.ca.1843 Ind.

Two other McKee families, living in Rochester Twp in 1850, near the Anthony W. McKee household, and who were probably related, were: (1) David A. McKee b.1816 Ohio, identified as a "miller" in 1860 census, m. (by 1841) Sarah A., and it was this family, with whom Reubin Stroup resided in 1850. (2) Russell McKee b.ca.1820 Ohio, m. Frances (-----) (by 1847), and their household in 1860 included Anthony McKee (ae 64).

Jesse McKee, b.ca.1830 Ohio, and Brant McKee b.1832 Ohio, wre of Union Twp in 1850. Jesse was probably the 40 yr invalid (b. Ohio) living with William McKee in Rochester Twp in 1870, & was probably his brother. Brant McKee m. Catharine McCoy 1855, and they resided in Union Twp, later removing to Rochester Twp by 1870 where he died in 1875, and was buried in the McKee cemetery (see below).

[NOTE: The lower half of the stone is all that remains. This must be the above-mentioned stone. Manitou Chapter D.A.R., *Genealogical Survey, Fulton County, Indiana Cemeteries*,

1935 reveals: David A. McKee, d. Feb 20, 1873, ae 56y-3m-25d. He resided in Rochester 1860, in Newcastle Twp in 1870, and his widow was living in Bloomingsburg, Newcastle Twp in 1880.]

STROUP, Reuben, son of J. & M., d. Dec 14, 1853, ae 16y-5d

[NOTE: There is no clear certainty as to the names of the parents of Reuben Strout. The name is spelled several ways: Stroup, Stroub, Straub, Stroab and Strobe.

Indiana Census 1840, includes: Samuel Stroup, in Elkhart Co. Barnhart's *History of Fulton Co Ind*, p. 32, states that Samuel Stroub was an early settler of Wayne Twp., Fulton Co., in 1840. *Fulton Co Ind Early Tract Book*, shows that Samuel Stroab of Cass Co Ind purchased land in Wayne Twp, 1841. Also *Fulton Co Ind Commissioners Record "A"*, includes the name of Samuel Stroub in the list of Petit Jurors for Sept. Term 1843. And lastly, concerning the estate of Samuel Stroub, Admr., Jacob Shafer, was appt'd Sept. 29, 1849, and Final Report was accepted July Term 1854 (Jean C. & Wendell C. Tombaugh, *Fulton Co Ind Probate Docket "A", 1836-1856*).

Martha Stroub, b.ca.1814 Penn, might have been the mother of Reuben Stroup. Obviously, Martha first m. a Stroup, and next Spencer Gill Dec. 25, 1849. Spencer Gill was a resident of Ripley Co Ind in 1840 (*Census*; also see *Fulton Co Ind M.R.*) Spencer Gill and his wife, Martha, his four children, and her son Silas V. Stroub (ae 3yr) were residents of Fulton Co Ind, Wayne Twp, in 1850 Census. The *Fulton Co Ind Census 1860*, reflects still a third marriage for Martha, and *Fulton Co Ind M.R.* indicate that on Nov. 15, 1857, Martha Gill m. Samuel Stubbs.

Samuel and Elias Stubb and Joseph Stroup were all residents of Shelby Co Ind in 1840, and were perhaps acquainted before coming to Fulton Co.

Samuel Stubbs, 1814-1889 (*Fulton Co Ind Cem, Union Twp*) and his 2nd wife, Martha, his four children, and her three children: Silas M. Stroub (ae 14yr), Albert A. Stroub (ae 11yr), and Mary Gill (ae 7yr), residents of Wayne Twp, Fulton Co Ind (*Census 1860*)

Fulton Co Ind Guardianship Index indicates that guardianship papers were filed on April 5, 1855, for Silas Strobe; final report date April 19, 1866. Silas M. Stroub was a Pvt Co A, 155 Regt Ind, in the Civil War (Peattie, *History of Fulton Co Ind*, p. 12)

Elias probably came to Fulton Co soon after 1850, and his first wife died soon after that (see above). He next m., July 31, 1853, Hannah Blodget (*Fulton Co Ind M.R.*), and they were householders of Rochester Twp, this county, in 1860 (*Census*), with four of the children of Elias & Thirzy Smith: Jesse, William, Elizabeth, and Mary; and two children of Elias & Hannah: Oliver & John W. Smith.

Elias Smith, ae 60, was a householder of Rochester Twp in 1870. The 1870 Census does not include his wife, but there were four children: Jesse, Mary, Oliver, and an eight year old Martha. His third marriage occurred sometime after the 1870 census, to Esther Smith.]

ELIZABETH LINDSEY GRAVE

LINDSEY/LINDSAY, Elizabeth, 1796-1832, ae 36y

The Evening Sentinel, Rochester, Indiana, Wednesday, September 20, 1899, reports that the oldest graveyard used by white people of the county was just east of the "waterworks standpipe" and that there were about thirty graves there. Several of the stones had the date of 1832, one of which was Elizabeth Lindsay.

Elizabeth, daughter of William Shields who died in Jennings County, Indiana in 1824, married John Lindsey. John Lindsey came to Fulton County, Indiana, in 1827 from Carroll County, Indiana, with Gen. Samuel Milroy and others of that county, to build a mill, south of the present dam location at the outlet and upon the banks of Lake Manitou. The Lindsey home, a grist mill, blacksmith shop, trading post and other homes were located in the little settlement called "Tiptonville." John Lindsey became the first blacksmith, serving as such until around 1838.

Elizabeth (Shields) Lindsey appears to have come to Fulton County at a later date, perhaps around 1830. An account by William A. Ward around 1905, indicates that John Lindsey, his wife and two or three children, came to Rochester in 1831 by covered wagon, from some point in Ohio. Another account indicates that Elizabeth Lindsey came with her sister, Rhoda (wife of Nathan Rose, the miller), and two brothers, William J. Shields and Jesse Shields. Mrs. Lindsey and Mrs. Rose were the first white women residents of Fulton County, Indiana. (*Fulton County, IN, Historical Society Quarterlies, 1964-1973*; also Elia W. James Brouillette, a barber, was born September 22, 1834 at Logansport, Ind., a son of M. B. "Bradley" and Mary Elizabeth (-----) Brouillette. His grave marker states he died in 1901. However, his obituary (*Rochester Evening Sentinel*, Fri., March 7, 1902), reveals that he died "Monday, age 67yr & 11da, at his home at the corner of Washington & Jefferson streets, at Rochester, Ind." His survivors included: two bros, Tom & Bradley of Vincennes; a sis, Mrs. Tilly Deunion of Elmwood Place, Ohio; his wife, and son (Charles).

Nancy (Nixon) Brouillette, wife of James A., was b. in Ontario Canada, dau of Allen & Sarah Nixon, natives of Ontario Canada. Nancy (Nixon) Brouillette had sisters: Eliza Jane (b.ca.1831 Can, m. Isaac Good, and prob. d. between 1870-75); Sarah A. (b.ca.1832 Can, 1m. (1st) David Sheets, and (2nd) Isaac Good, widower); Catharine (b.ca.1835 Can, d.1871, m. Alexander H. Sheets). (See: *Fulton Co Ind Census 1850*, Rochester Twp (two entries) "Alexa. Chamberlin, Innkeeper" with Sarah Nixon, Sr. and three of her children, dated August 15, and "Allen Nixon" and Sarah with four children, dated August 20. *Census 1860* (same Co & Twp) "Allen & Sarah Nixon" with dau Nancy, and Francis Bruett (ae 13, laborer) who was the bro of James A. Brouillette. Also see Jean C. & Wendell C. Tombaugh, *Fulton Co Ind Cem Inscr, Henry Twp*, Omega cem; also *Evening Sentinel*, Friday, June 29, 1906, obit "Mrs. Nancy Brouillette", which states that she died at home of her son, Charles, in South Chicago.

M. B. "Bradley" Brouillette, father of James A., was a tailor, and b.ca.1810 in Ind. His wife Mary Elizabeth (1816-1855) was bur in this cemetery, but the death date of M. B., her husband, is not known. They were residents of Rochester Twp, Fulton Co Ind, in 1850 (*Census*) with six children. Children of M. B. & M. E. Brouillette included: (all b.Ind), James A., b.1834; Mary E. b.ca.1838, m. Junkin Jacobs, a sadler, 1855; Anthony b.ca.1840; Austin C. (1842-1843); Francis J., b. at Rochester 1846, d. Henry Twp, "Tues", a son of Brad, and a half-bro of James A. Brouillette. He m. Celistia A. Woods (1852-1933, dau of Wm. & Nancy M. (Rannells) Woods). Survivors included his wife, (2 bros) Thomas & Brad, both of Vincennes Ind, (sis) Lydia of Plymouth Ind (*Evening Sentinel*, Tues, Dec. 28, 1909 obit "Frank J. Brouillette"; *Fulton Co Ind M.R.*; Jean C. & Wendell C. Tombaugh, *Fulton Co Ind Cem Inscr, Henry Twp*, Hoover cem and Omega cem); Ann M. b.ca.1847; Thomas b.ca.1849;

Martha A. (1855-1855); (Bradley & Lydia?)]

Susan B. was b. in Ohio, and may have been a dau of the John Downey (b.ca.1805) Massachusetts, who was with the Nathaniel Webber household in 1860 (*See Fulton Co Ind Census 1860*, Rochester Twp "Nathaniel Webber", and 1870 Rochester Twp "Benjamin Patton", 1880 Rochester city, "Susan Patton, widow"; also *Fulton Co Ind M.R.*)

"Gould" Kilmer and Margaret C. "Cassie" (his 2nd wife) were residents of Rochester Twp in 1880 with three children: Cloe (1874-1892); Bessie b.ca.1876; George b.ca.1878. Charles A. Kilmer, 1869-1933, son of Lorin G. "Gould" and Eliza Jane (Spencer) ;Kilmer, was probably the ten-yr-old Charles, identified as a "son" with the John M. & Sarah J. (Harsh) Spencer family in 1880. Charles A. Kilmer m. Indiana V. Baker (1873-1944), May 30, 1894, and both bur in Rochester I.O.O.F. cem. (*Fulton Co Ind M.R.*; *I.O.O.F. cem, Rochester*). (3) Austin J. Spencer, b.ca.1850; (4) John W. Spencer, b.ca.1852, m. Mary J.

(2) Mason b.ca.1820 N.Y., was living with his bro., Edwin, shortly before Mason Chamberlain m., August 25, 1860, Lydia (----) Bear. Lydia Bear (b.ca.1835 Ohio), widow of David Bear (1829-1857), was a resident of Rochester city in 1860 (*Census*), with children Mary S. Bear (b.ca.1852) and Charles D. Bear (b.1857 - d.1860) (see grave marker, Row 12, this Section). They were not in Fulton Co Ind in 1870. (*Fulton Co Ind M.R. & Census*). (3) Jared, b.ca.1827 N.Y.; (4) Clarissa, b.ca.1826 N.Y.; (5) Louisa, b.ca.1830 N.Y.; (6) George, b.ca.1832 N.Y.

Leander Chamberlain was not a resident of Indiana in 1820 (*Census*). He was in New York at least until ca.1832 when his son, George, was born. He was found in the list of householders of Fulton Co Ind in 1840, along with Alex. Chamberlain, Sr., and Alex., Jr. *Fulton Co Ind Early Tract Book* indicates that Leander Chamberlain took up several parcels of land in Newcastle Twp during 1842-1845. The parentage of Leander Chamberlain is not

certain to this writer. His birth date indicates he may have been the son of a Rev. Soldier (a brother of William, father of Alexander Chamberlain, Sr.?). Leander & Alexander, Sr., were only a year apart in age, and both were born in N.Y. An earlier Leander Chamberlain, b. January 25, 1766 & d. June 16, 1822; Pvt of Conn, Pension papers Conn S40826, m. Mercy Berry (See *D.A.R. Patriot Index*, p. 122; *Index of Rev. War Pension Applications* by National Genealogical Society, p. 212.)

William Chamberlain, b.1754 at Kent, Connecticut, was a Rev. War Soldier of Conn., and was m. twice. The names of nine of his children follow. Although there undoubtedly were others, these are the only ones known to this writer.

(1) Alexander "Aleck", Sr., soldier of War 1812, was at the Battle of Lundy's Lane. He was b. March 28, 1788, at Kinderhook, Columbia Co N.Y., and d. January 9, 1869 in Fulton Co Ind. He m. 4 times: (1st) to Irene -----; (2nd) to Mary Kitchen in 1810 (1790-1850); (3rd) to Frances Dennis April 2, 1851, and divorced during February Term 1856 (*Fulton Co Circuit Court Bench Docket*, 1845-1859); (4th), sometime between 1856 and 1860, to Mrs. Margaret (-----) Adair (b.1821 Ireland, d.1913 (See *Fulton Co Ind Will Book "E" - "Margaret Rees"*). Margaret (-----) Adair Chamberlain m. next Wm. Rees, January 12, 1870, who was a mail carrier of the city of Rochester Ind (*Census 1870*). Alexander Chamberlain, Sr., is prob. the same Alexander Chamberlain who was in the list of householders of Vigo Co Ind in 1820, with a wife, three daus all under 10 yrs, and a male 16-25 yrs.

Alexander Chamberlain, Sr., removed from Terre Haute Ind, "Ft. Harrison Prairie", to Logansport, Cass Co Ind, as early as August 1826. There opposite the mouth of Eel River, he built a tavern. His sign read "Entertainment by A. Chamberlain". He sold it to Francis Murphy, Sr., July 6, 1833. In the spring of 1835, he moved to Fulton Co Ind, and erected the first hotel (tavern) in Rochester. His children included: Elizabeth Mary, b.1816 N.Y., d.1855 Ind, m. M. B. "Bradley" Brouillette; Sarah Ann, b.ca.1817 N.Y. (could have first m., 1839, Gilbert Bozarth, from Cass Co Ind, and later removed to Kansas), said to have m. a Baron; Amanda M., b.ca.1820, d. January 29, 1868 Minneapolis, Minn, m. April 5, 1837 Anthony F. Smith (Fulton Co Ind M.R., b.1817, son of James & Nancy (Furtad) Smith. Res. of Minneapolis 1865-1868, then returned to Logansport Ind. Children were: James A., George C., Charles R., Albert F., Milo R. and perhaps four others, names unkn. Anthony F. Smith next m. April 15, 1868, Mrs. Mary Ann (Barron) Heth (dau of Joseph & Josephine (Gamelin) Barren of Cass Co Ind, and widow of Harvey Heth); Mary, b.ca.1858 Ind, dau of the 4th wife, Margaret, m. (-----) Stanard & lived in Illinois: Charles Henry Adair, b.1851 Ind, son of Margaret (-----) Adair Chamberlain Rees, was said to be living in San Francisco, Calif., at time of his mother's death. (References; see *Fulton Co Ind Census; Marriages; Chamberlain Family History*, Fulton Co Historical Society; Helms, *Cass Co Ind History*, p. 388; Kingman Bros. *Atlas, Fulton Co Ind*, pp. 20-22).

Sylvester Chamberlain, son of William (Rev soldier), was b.1804 N.Y., and d.1881 in Dayton Ohio. He was a resident of St. Joseph Co Ind in 1840 Census. Sylvester Chamberlain

was married twice: (1st) to Josaphine ---- (b. Rome Italy, d.1842); and (2nd), March 25, 1843 at Pleasant Grove (now Kewanna) Ind, to Catharine Willson (*Fulton Co Ind M.R.*) Catharine, b.1819 Glasgow Scotland, was a dau of William & Anna (Dary) Willson, who moved from Canada to Rome, Oneida Co N.Y., ca.1822, and from there to Indiana in the fall of 1842. Catharine's sister, Anna F. Willson, m. Francis K. Kendrick. Catharine (Willson) Chamberlain died in Oak Park, Illinois, 1893, and was bur in Dayton, Ohio.

Sylvester Chamberlain was a "hatter" and a "grocer". His children were: (1) Chester, b. January 1, 1835 Newark, N.Jer., m. 1865 Sarah C. (10) Alice, b.ca.1859 (twin), d. inf.

He was twice married: (1st) ca.1785, to Azula Robbins; and (2nd), September 13, 1834, to Eleanor (Tong/Tonguel) Rankins, widow of Daniel Rankins a Rev. War soldier. Children of George

Washburn:

Sperry, son of Samuel G. & Rachel, was b. in Wayne Co Ind, February 4, 1832; died sometime between 1872 and 1880 (*1880 Census*, Rochester Twp, Clemenza Sperry, age 46 and widowed, with twin daus and two sons). Emma J. (Nye) Davidson m. (2nd) September 11, 1896 at Rochester Ind to Samuel Aikens. She was 41 and he was 43. Samuel Akins was a carpenter, b. in Zanesville Ohio ca.1854, and was a son of David and Eva (Smith) Akins. It was his 2nd marriage.

William A. Davidson, first husband of Emma J., was b.ca.1857, and was a son of William H. and Nancy S. (Chinn) Davidson.

(3) Lorain (Also "Lawrence" and "Loring"), b.ca.1835 Ind, d.ca.1862. He was ca.12 years old when his mother tried to kill herself. He dragged her out of the house and extinguished the flames. She then ran into the barn and set it afire and burned to death in it. Her son brooded about it and became insane. At about 26, he filled his mouth with tobacco and choked to death.
