#### Summer Reading Program Rules (SRP)

- 1. No books will be counted that are checked out before June 1 or after July 20, 2015.
- 2. Books must be checked out overnight and brought to a circulation desk to be counted. Books just left in the drop box or on the desk will not qualify.
- 3. All items and programs will count for points.
- 4. Weekly give away when books are returned.
- 5. At least one prize will be given away at the weekly drawing. There will be a weekly list of winners.
- 6. Tickets for drawings are one each time books are returned and one per week. They will be discarded at the end of each weekly drawing to provide new chances each week.
- 7. Preschoolers may have books read to them. Older children or parents reading to younger children will count on both scores.
- 8. Information on SRP cards will be completed by staff as books are returned.
- 9. Our SRP is designed to encourage patrons of all ages to read.




