Save the Date: Tuesday, April 26 Learn the Signs, Act Early: An Autism Resource Workshop

April is Autism Awareness Month. The incidence of Autism and other developmental delays appears to be on the rise. Recent studies suggest that about 1 in 6 children have been diagnosed with a developmental disability.

As part of engaging the conversation, the Fulton County Public Library and Lifelong Learners' Project is offering a Center for Disease Control workshop titled *Learn the Signs, Act Early* on Tuesday, April 26 at 6:00.

The workshop will be facilitated by Stephan Viehweg, associate director at the Riley Child Development Center's *Leadership Education in Neurodevelopmental Disorders* program,

The Center for Disease Control (CDC) appointed Viehweg for a second term as Act Early Ambassador for the State of Indiana because of his "commitment to improving the lives of children and their families and involvement in numerous programs to increase access of services and resources for children with developmental concerns." National Poetry Month: Blackout Poetry Challenge

This April marks the 20th anniversary of National Poetry Month, which was inaugurated by the Academy of American Poets in 1996. Over the years, National Poetry Month has become the largest literary celebration in the world with schools, publishers, libraries, booksellers, and poets celebrating poetry's vital place in our culture.

Noun: A Writing Project, at its first session, introduced various means of engaging the writing process. This month's focus: blackout poetry. The author can use black markers, crayons, white-out, etc., to cross out or eliminate whatever words or images they see as unnecessary or irrelevant to the effect they are seeking to create. The central idea is to devise a completely new text from previously published words and images.

Throughout the library there will be pages for use in writing your own blackout poem. Examples of blackout poems can be seen in the literacy office. Our very own Kristyn Childers has displayed some of her work.

If you would like to display a blackout poem that you are proud of, you can submit them to any department in the library or specifically to Timothy Roe in the literacy office. All ages are encouraged to participate.

Noun will meet for its next session on Thursday, April 21st at 6:00 in Meeting Room B for a presentation on Romanian and French avant-garde poet Tristan Tzara. Following the presentation time will be set aside for a poetry reading.




