Learn: A Project

Noun, a writing class offered through Literacy, will be meeting Thursday, September 22nd at 6:30 pm in Meeting Room A. The subject will be a study in the language of graphic novels. How exactly does a picture paint a thousand words? Building on some of the foundational elements covered in previous classes, the aim will be to demystify graphic novels. The content will be from *Understanding Comics* by Scott McCloud. McCloud is an American cartoonist and academic comic theorist. ## Graphic Novels @ FCPL

Comics and graphic novels are growing in popularity. At the FCPL, we have quite a collection of graphic novels located at the end of the adult science fiction section. The concept of juxtaposing images and words is being theorized in universities as an efficient and effective means of teaching and learning. It is also theorized that graphic novels are the evolution of mythology in modern time. Comics are defined as "Juxtaposed pictorial and other images in deliberate sequence, intended to convey information and/or to produce an aesthetic response in the viewer." Anthropologists, using the definition provided by Scott McCloud, author of the academic text Understanding Comics, trace the concept of comics back to Egyptian hieroglyphs, Neolithic cave painting, and even various image laden oral histories.

Visual iconography is considered the vocabulary of comics. The grammar of comics, according to McCloud, is closure. Closure is the "phenomenon of observing the parts but perceiving the whole, or interpreting the white space." In other words, closure is the act of mentally filling in the gaps of what we observe, comprehending the action and meaning between two seemingly unrelated panels. It is this white space that is being explored as a dynamic way of teaching.

Many genres are using comics as a medium; memoir is one of these. Check out *Maus*, Art Spiegelman's family memoir of the Holocaust or *Over Easy*, Mimi Pond's classic memoir of the being a hippy in the 70's. If you are interested in a psychology of dreams, check out Neil Gaiman's *Sandman*. If you are interested in philosophy or environmental concerns, you should read the works of Alan Moore, including *Watchmen*, *V for Vendetta*, or *Saga of Swamp Thing*. Check one out and experience it yourself.




#### **American Sign Language**
